sion to expand TUSEME activities through its Secondary Education Development Programme (SEDP) in response to suggestions from the Department of Performing Arts, the Forum for African Women Educationists (FAWE).

"Therefore the ministry is planning to expand TUSEME programme to all Tanzania Mainland secondary schools, come 2009.

The head of the Department of Performing Arts of the

University of Dar es Salaam and the Co-ordinator of TUSEME Festival Dr Frowin Nyoni, said the project that was introduced in 1996 empowers girls to understand and overcome problems that hinder their academic and social development.

He said the project also enables girls to identify on factors that make students drop out of school, poor academic performance, pregnancy during school, sexual harassment and other gender related problems.
